

Behaviour Counselling

Falkland Veterinary Clinic is now able to provide one to one behavioural counselling for problems your pets may have, via veterinary referral. Consultations are available at present for dogs, cats, and birds for behavioural issues including;

Behaviour Issues:

- Aggression
- Inappropriate toileting
- Separation Anxiety
- Spraying
- Feather Picking
- Fears and Phobias (e.g. Fireworks)
- Chasing Livestock

Our in- house consultant, Kate Bundy has been working at the practice as a veterinary nurse since 2003, and has since successfully completed a Bachelor of Science Honours degree in Animal Behaviour and Welfare from Bristol Veterinary School. She has also recently gained her certification as a fully qualified Animal Welfare Officer.

What will the consultation Include ?

Before your consultation your animal will be required to have a full health check with your veterinary surgeon to investigate any possible underlying medical conditions that may be affecting your pet's behaviour. After which, your vet will refer you and a questionnaire will be given to you to fill out and return before your consultation.

Consultations require taking a detailed history from you on your pet and its problems, before a treatment program can be devised. This can take a couple of hours depending on the nature of the problem(s) so please allow enough time for this.

During the consultation, a treatment program will be devised for your pet for you to undergo at home, and eight weeks of follow up contact are included in the consultation price. We will also accept pet insurance if your policy covers behavioural treatment.
